DETAILS FOR 4TH OF JULY PARADE IN IDAHO CITY



MAKE YOUR WAY TO IDAHO CITY:

Some may want to meet at the Hightower shop and leave by 9:00 a.m..

Others may want to meet at Albertsons parking lot at the junction of Federal Way and Highway 21 off the freeway at exit 57 by 9:45 a.m.

Drive up Highway 21 to Idaho City - about 39 miles. Turn left onto Montgomery Street to the High School. The parking lot is on the left side of the school and is the parade staging area. Find Rob for directions. You should arrive by 11:00 a.m.

Decorate your cars while waiting for the parade to start at Noon. Don't forget to bring candy to throw to the children watching the parade.

The PARADE is down Main Street to the Highway and back up Montgomery Street to the high school parking lot. It is short but really fun and appreciated by the folks watching.

After the parade make your way down Montgomery Street to the park, just behind the Museum. The Historical Society is selling hot dogs or brats with chips and a soft drink for \$6. There will also be beer and snow cones for sale. Bring a chair and listen to the reading of The Declaration of Independence. This is small town patriotism at its best—Enjoy! Go home at your own pace.

Jakob and Tiffany were married on June 3rd and there was a lovely reception that afternoon. The newlyweds will reside in Provo while they finish their college education.


